Recycling & Solid Waste Planning

The division administers the Solid Waste, Recycling, Household Hazardous Waste, and Clean Communities Programs. Coordinates all solid waste and recycling planning functions for the municipalities of Passaic County, to include solid waste and recycling facility reviews, recycling collection and disposal programs, educational programming, and public outreach activities.

Mosquito Control

Reduce mosquito populations to a manageable level that both preserves the quality of life for the people of Passaic County and reduces the likelihood of disease transmission while causing as little impact to the environment as possible.



<u>Overdose Fatality Review Team</u> (<u>OFRT)</u>

Meets monthly and reviews factors that cause or are correlated with fatal overdoses, identifies gaps or barriers to service, promotes cross sector coordination and collaboration, informs county-wide prevention efforts, and provides recommendations and implements changes to the policies and protocols of government agencies or private entities that will support the effort of reducing fatal overdose in Passaic County.

<u>The Medical Reserve Corps</u> (<u>MRC</u>)

National network of more than 200,000 volunteers, organized locally to improve the health and safety of their communities. MRC volunteers step up to keep their family, friends, and neighbors safe and healthy.
