## Community Services and Individual Supports

One-on-one services at home or community-based, focusing on skills for daily living, socializing, self-care, and recreation to increase independence, productivity, enhanced family functioning, and inclusion in the community.



## Employment Programs

Ohel helps adults with developmental disabilities prepare for — and maintain — employment through pre-employment training and job coaching in a supportive, encouraging, and fun environment.

### Prevocational Program

Tailored to individuals who are interested in joining the workforce, this program includes discovery, assessment, job skills training, and placement, while focusing on participants' abilities and passions.

While most of the job skills training takes place one-on-one, our Prevocational Program also includes enriching group activities and socialization opportunities.

## Supportive Employment Services

Our programs help individuals discover careers that match their abilities and passions, so they can enjoy volunteering and working in their communities and lead more fulfilling lives.

We provide job coaching for adults who are engaged in paid employment to help enhance their experiences, improve on-the-job interactions, and maintain employment. Some of the jobs participants have held are cook, cashier, stock assistant, personal shopper, hospital personnel, grocery bagger, delivery person, mailroom clerk, food prepper, receptionist, and clerical staff.
