Transitional Family Shelter



We are a transitional shelter for families who have become homeless. Keeping the family intact by sheltering them in one of our three private apartment units provides the family a sense of

normalcy, while they focus on the real issues at hand learning skills and other techniques to avoid the recurrence of homelessness. This is especially critical for the emotional and physical well-being of the children in the family.

We provide case management for the family including an individualized plan to help them get back on track. We work in cooperation with other social services to help the family find safe, affordable housing and to assure the family receives all available benefits.

Our goal is to solve homelessness in families one family at a time.



Healthy Food Pantry

Serving 2500+ household members each month, our food panty provides a five day supply of nutritious groceries to families in our community impacted by hunger and poverty. With each visit, we provide healthy food including fresh produce, low salt/sugar foods and meat, breads and dairy. It is our belief that everyone should have access to healthy affordable food which in turn leads to better nutrition and a generally healthier lifestyle.



Access to healthy food is just one of the obstacles facing our clients. Concerned for their overall well being, we are a resource center with access to other services including housing and employment opportunities, social ser-

vices, health and well being services.

Services offered through the year include warm coats in winter, a turkey with all the fixings at Thanksgiving and holiday toys.

Homeless Street Outreach



In conjunction with the City of Clifton we provide case management, food, clothing and hygiene items to the street homeless and host shower days with a shower hygiene trailer.

Our Community Garden

In a continuing effort to provide healthy food access to everyone, we have a community garden. Our aardens provide a space where a community can come together and share in the benefits of gardening - learning new skills, making new friends and producing healthy, fresh produce.
